



Anthony Terence O'Sullivan

Anthony O'Sullivan has been the Head of the Private Sector Development Division at the Organization for Economic Cooperation and Development (OECD) since September 2005. He started his career as a consultant at Accenture, specializing in M&A and post merger integration in the pharmaceuticals and fast moving consumer goods sectors, both in Europe and internationally. Pursuing his work on strategy and M&A he then joined Michael Porter's Monitor Group where he also developed his credentials on country competitiveness. O'Sullivan went on to become a founding partner of Adcore, specializing in due diligences and business creation for high tech investment funds. Amongst other successes, he designed and launched a 100M€ investment fund for a leading French public sector bank. Before moving to the OECD in 2005, O'Sullivan spent three and a half years at A.T. Kearney, as a senior manager in strategy, and as the European representative for the Global Business Policy Council, a leading global think tank on government strategy and country competitiveness.

He received an Honours degree in Economics, Finance and Political Science from McGill University in Montreal, before receiving his Masters from the London School of Economics in Economic Development in 2004.
