### **Eduard H. Hochreiter**

Eduard Hochreiter, born in Innsbruck/Tyrol in 1947, was educated at the Vienna University of Economics; the London School of Economics, and the Johns Hopkins University, Bologna Center. He is married and has three children.

In August 2006 he joined the International Monetary Fund and was appointed director of the Joint Vienna Institute ([www.jvi.org](http://www.jvi.org)). Previously Eduard Hochreiter had worked for the Oesterreichische Nationalbank for more than 30 years. In his last assignment at the Bank he directed important areas of the Bank's long-term research.

In addition, he served as an Alternate member of the Economic and Finance Committee of the EU (EFC), as Secretary General of the Société Universitaire Européenne de Recherches Financières (SUERF), on the Research Advisory Board of the Czech National Bank, and on the Executive Boards of CEMS (College of European Management Schools), the International Atlantic Economic Society and of the Western Economic Association.

Eduard Hochreiter is Associate Professor at the University of Economics, Vienna, taught at various summer universities and lectured at a wide range of universities. He has published extensively in refereed journals on international monetary issues such as monetary and exchange rate policies, European integration, transitioning economics, and on central bank independence.
