Dr OTHON ANASTASAKIS is the Director of South East European Studies at Oxford (SEESOX), University of Oxford and a Research Fellow at St Antony's College. Previously he was Researcher at the London School of Economics; Expert & Advisor on European Union matters at the Greek Ministry of Foreign Affairs. He received his BA in Economics from the University of Athens, his MA in Comparative Politics and International Relations from Columbia University, New York and his PhD in Comparative Government from the London School of Economics. His research interests include the EU's eastern enlargement, transition and democratization in South East Europe, Greek foreign policy, Turkish developments and relations with the EU relations, European nationalism and extreme right.

He is currently co-authoring a book on "Democratisation in the post-communist Balkans" (to be published by Palgrave, Macmillan)

Some recent topics include: political leadership in Greece and the Balkans, political and economic reform in the Western Balkans, the EU enlargement of Bulgaria and Romania, the EU and Turkey, the Cyprus problem, migration to the EU from its near abroad, political and economic developments in Bosnia-Herzegovina and the Greek-Turkish rapprochement.

He supervises D.Phil, Masters and Diploma theses on South East European and Turkish matters at the Department of Politics and International Relations, University of Oxford.

He has been co-ordinating and/or co-operating in numerous projects funded by the European Commission 5th and 6th Frameworks on the themes of Regional cooperation in the Balkans (2001-2), Borders and security in South East Europe (IBEU, 2003-05), Migration to the EU (GLOMIG, 2006-07), Crime and Culture in Europe (STRET, 2006-2008), Mediterranean Network of Excellence (RAMSES, 2005-07).
