

Tim Hatton is Professor of Economics at the University of Essex, where he was Chair of the Department of Economics from 1997 to 2000. He is also a Professor in the Faculty of Economics and Commerce at the Australian National University. He is a Research Fellow of the Centre for Economic Policy Research (CEPR, London) and of the Institute for Research in Labour Economics (IZA, Bonn).

Tim Hatton works on the economics of migration and asylum. His book (with Jeffrey G. Williamson) *The Age of Mass Migration: An Economic Analysis* (OUP, 1998) provides a quantitative and analytical account of the causes and consequences of mass migration from Europe to the New World in the late nineteenth century. A forthcoming book (also with Williamson) *Global Migration and the World Economy: Two Centuries of Policy and Performance* (MIT Press 2006) provides an analysis of the main currents of migration and of the long-run evolution of immigration and asylum policies, comparing the past with the present. His research interests also include the labour market, unemployment and economic policy (mainly in the UK) from 1870 to the present.
