

Dalia Marin holds the Chair in International Economics at the University of Munich. She obtained her Habilitation (post-doctorate degree) in Economics from Vienna University of Economics in 1992; until 1994 she was Assistant Professor at the Institute for Advanced Studies in Vienna and Associate Professor at Humboldt University Berlin (1994-1998). She has been visiting professor or visiting scholar at the IMF, Stanford University, Harvard University, National Bureau of Economic Research, Cambridge, European University Institute, and the Wissenschaftszentrum Berlin.

Her research interests are in the area of international economics, corporate finance and the organization of the firm, and in emerging market economies. Her work, both theoretical and empirical, has been published in several top journals such as the *American Economic Review*, *Economic Journal*, *Review of Economics and Statistics*, *Journal of the European Economic Association*, and the *European Economic Review*. Her book (joint with M. Schnitzer) "Contracts in Trade and Transition" was published by the MIT Press in 2002.

She is Associate Editor of the *Journal of the European Economic Association*, Chair of the Scientific Council of the Minerva Center in Macroeconomics and Economic Growth, Hebrew University Jerusalem, Fellow of the International Trade and the Transition Economics Program at the Centre for Economic Policy Research (CEPR) in London, and Member of the International Trade and Organization Program of the National Bureau of Economic Research (NBER), Cambridge. She has been Team Leader at the Russian European Center for Economic Policy in Moscow (1998-2000) and has acted as a consultant for the World Bank, Washington, for the European Bank for Reconstruction and Development (EBRD), London, and for the International Monetary Fund, Washington.
