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Dmitri Jegorov, an Estonian national, is the IMF Regional Revenue Advisor for Southeast Europe (SEE). He works with the revenue administrations of Serbia and North Macedonia since September 2020 to assist their reform progress and is based at the JVI in Vienna. Before joining the IMF, Dmitri served as Undersecretary for tax and customs policy at the Estonian Ministry of Finance. Prior to that, for nearly ten years, Dmitri served in different managerial positions at the Estonian Tax and Customs Board. Over the years, he has dealt with taxpayer service, interpretation of legislation, customs procedures, revenue accounting, development of business processes and IT solutions, audit, tax debts, and investigation.

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Martin Riedler is a Corporate Income Tax expert at the Central Specialized Unit for Legal Affairs of the Federal Ministry of Finance. He represents Austria at OECD level as a delegate and as part of the “bureau” (executive committee) of the OECD Working Party for Aggressive Tax Planning, that has been developing the GloBE rules (Global anti-base erosion rules) as part of the OECD/G20 two-pillar solution to address the tax challenges arising from digitalization and globalization of the economy.

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
